

Father, forgive us. Strengthen us to love and obey you in newness of life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The celebrant pronounces the Absolution.

Almighty God, who has promised forgiveness to all who turn to him in faith: pardon you and set you free from all your sins, strengthen you in all goodness and keep you in eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Kyries are sung at 9.30am by the people and sung by the choir at 11.00am.

Numbers 6.22-27



PSALM 67

The Psalm is led by the cantor and the response is sung by all.



May God be gracious to us and bless us and make his face to shine upon us, that your way may be known upon earth, your saving power among all nations. **R.**

Let the nations be glad and sing for joy, for you judge the peoples with equity and guide the nations upon earth. Let the peoples praise you, O God; let all the peoples praise you. **R.**

The earth has yielded its increase; God, our God, has blessed us. May God continue to bless us; let all the ends of the earth revere him. **R.**

THE EPISTLE: Galations 4.4-7. chanted by the Sub-Deacon at 11.00am

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Galations.

When the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children. And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" So you are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir, through God.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them. After eight days had passed, it was time to circumcise the child; and he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel.

Grant that what we have asked in faith we may by your grace receive, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Please stand for the Greeting of Peace. Celebrant:

We are the body of Christ.

His Spirit is with us.

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

And also with you.

OFFERTORY ANTIPHON [Sung by the choir at 11 am]

Hail Mary, full of grace; the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb.

Please join in the offertory hymn.

Sing we of the blessed Mother who received the angel's word, And obedient to his summons bore in love the infant Lord; Sing we of the joys of Mary at whose breast that child was fed Who is Son of God eternal and the everlasting Bread.

Sing we, too, of Mary's sorrows, of the sword that pierced her through, When beneath the cross of Jesus she his weight of suffering knew, Looked upon her Son and Saviour reigning high on Calvary's tree, Saw the price of man's redemption paid to set the sinner free.

Celebrant:

May the Lord accept this sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his Holy Church.

The Celebrant prays the Prayer over the Offerings. People respond with Amen.

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Please kneel. The celebrant continues the prayer.

At 9.30am the Sanctus is sung by the people. At 11.00am the choir sings the Sanctus.

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

+ Blessed is he that comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The celebrant continues the prayer, leading to:

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith

The following responses and prayers are sung.



Celebrant:

We who are many are one body.

For we all share in the one bread.

All remaining kneeling as the Agnus Dei is said at 9.30am and sung by the choir at 11.00am.

Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us.

Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us.

Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: grant us peace.

Celebrant:

Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to the supper of the Lamb. Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed.

The Celebrant recites silently the Communion Antiphon.

Communicant members of any Christian church are invited to receive the sacrament. All others are very welcome to come forward for a blessing.

THE ANGELUS

At 11.00am only The Angelus is led and sung by the Celebrant.

The church bell rings three times during the recitation of the Hail Mary, and nine times during the final Collect.





Let us pray. We beseech thee O Lord, pour thy grace into our hearts, that as we have known the incarnation of thy son Jesus Christ by the message of an angel, so by his cross and passion we may be brought to the glory of his resurrection. Through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Sanctuary party processes to the West door for the final prayers and dismissal.



WEEKLY REFLECTIONS

From Carol O'Connor

John Rutter's choral setting for the blessing from the book of Numbers, *The Lord Bless You and Keep You*, hold harmonies that echo emotions of sadness as well as joy. The music enhances the task inherent in all blessings, which is to bear witness to the holiness of God; seek to make people more who they are meant to be.

The Eastern Orthodox Church uses the title *Theotokos* as its chosen name for Mary. It means God Bearer, the one who gave birth to God, Mother of God. When prayed with in the Christian icon tradition, the *Theotokos* is more than a visual aid. It is a window into the sacred.

When we bless, or name something as holy, we are acknowledging a liminal space: here is a window opening, inviting us to go deeper, to move closer towards, or to wait and receive from God. Blessings, like Christian icons, are vehicles of remembering, of thanksgiving; we honour and we also acknowledge. They are also reminders of the homeliness, as well as the strangeness of God.

The Nativity Play for the Children's Service we held here at St Peter's on Christmas Eve opened with the narrator's invitation for everyone present to 'imagine the stars in the sky, the countless constellations of the Milky Way, the grandeur of the sprawling universe. And in the corner of it, a little planet called Earth.' The first character who entered the stage space in front of the altar was a young woman in her home – Mary. So the nativity story is set: the amazing transcendent God of aeons of ages and infinite constellations, and this one woman, 'nothing particularly remarkable about', but whom 'to God was very important.' One woman, who in seeing herself to be a servant of God, becomes the very way God chose to enter a new way of being in the world through His Son.

We stand at the beginning of a new year. May our pilgrimage over the coming months be one where we are kept close to the knowledge of a God who yearns to draw near us. And may we each become more who we are meant to be because of this great blessing. May we be vehicles of healing, of challenge and bearers of peace in our world. And when we feel lost or the road gets terribly bumpy, may we turn and remember Mary, *Theotokos*, God Bearer, ever faithful to Jesus.
