VICAR'S MUSINGS

Seventy-seven years ago, twelve Anglican missionaries lost their lives during the Japanese invasion of Papua New Guinea. These brave women and men who chose to stay at their mission-posts were from PNG, England and Australia, and are among the more than three hundred Roman Catholics, Lutherans and other church workers who lost their lives during the horrific armed conflict of that time.

For today's marking of the New Guinea Martyrs' feast day, we warmly welcome our guest preacher Canon Gary Harch, who joins us from Brisbane with his wife Marie-Claire. Fr Gary will be preaching at all three morning Masses, and then after a light lunch in the Parish Hall, there will be an opportunity to hear him talk further about his research into the numerous New Guinea Martyrs' memorials across Australia. Our own Napier Waller memorial window is of course one of these.

We also welcome today, as Presiding Bishop at the High Mass, the Rt Rev'd Jeremy Ashton, who served as Bishop in PNG, and in May this year celebrated 43 years since his episcopal consecration.

Fr Gary has written a few words of below, by way of introduction:

Born and bred in Brisbane, Queensland, I initially trained as a surveyor and spent a month in PNG for a scientific expedition. I have been married to Marie-Claire for 20 years, and have served as a priest in Rockhampton, Middlemount, Brisbane, Roma and Toowoomba. I was Archdeacon of the West, and then the Downs, for some 18 years. The Archdeaconry of the West is approximately the size of Victoria! My scientific expeditions over the years have included Fiji, New Guinea, the Simpson Desert, and Sturt's Desert. I have been involved with environmental issues, especially around the Murray Darling.

Since November 2014 I have been the priest-in-charge of St Mary's Anglican Church Kangaroo Point. St Mary's is an inner-city Church, on the cliffs, overlooking the Brisbane River. I am also a residentiary Canon at St John's Cathedral, and have been on Brisbane Diocesan Council for 23 years. I am currently an Australian trainer of mentors for Education for Ministry (EfM) and an Australian trainer of facilitators for the Prepare-Enrich marriage preparation and enrichment program.

From 2006-14 I was the Rector at James' Toowoomba, about an hour and half's drive west of Brisbane. One of the New Guinea Martyrs, Fr John Barge, left from this parish to go to New Britain. This is what sparked my interest in knowing more about the Anglican New Guinea Martyrs. It was in my research for a Diocesan sermon that I realised there were many memorials around Australia and there was no central record. So began my ongoing quest to locate and photograph all of these and to get the background story to why these memorials were erected.

PARISH RETREAT TO BENEDICTINE ABBEY CAMPERDOWN

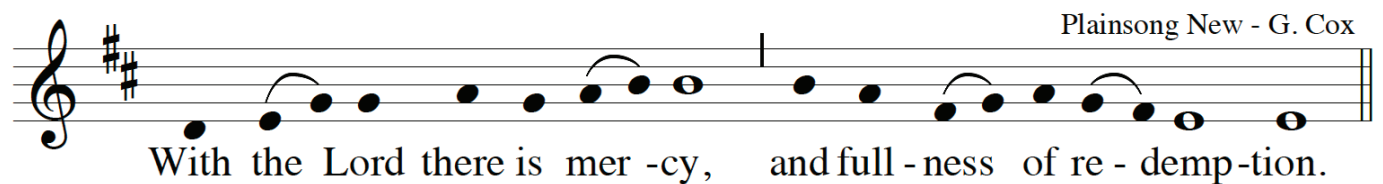

MASS READINGS

First Reading: Zephaniah 3: 14-20

Sing aloud, O daughter Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem! The Lord has taken away the judgments against you, he has turned away your enemies. The king of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst; you shall fear disaster no more. On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: Do not fear, O Zion; do not let your hands grow weak. The Lord, your God, is in your midst, a warrior who gives victory; he will rejoice over you with gladness, he will renew you in his love; he will exult over you with loud singing as on a day of festival. I will remove disaster from you, so that you will not bear reproach for it. I will deal with all your oppressors at that time. And I will save the lame and gather the outcast, and I will change their shame into praise and renown in all the earth. At that time I will bring you home, at the time when I gather you; for I will make you renowned and praised among all the peoples of the earth, when I restore your fortunes before your eyes, says the Lord.

Second Reading: Romans 8: 33-39

Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, 'For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered.' No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Gospel: John 12. 20-32

Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour. 'Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—"Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name.' Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, 'An angel has spoken to him.' Jesus answered, 'This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.'

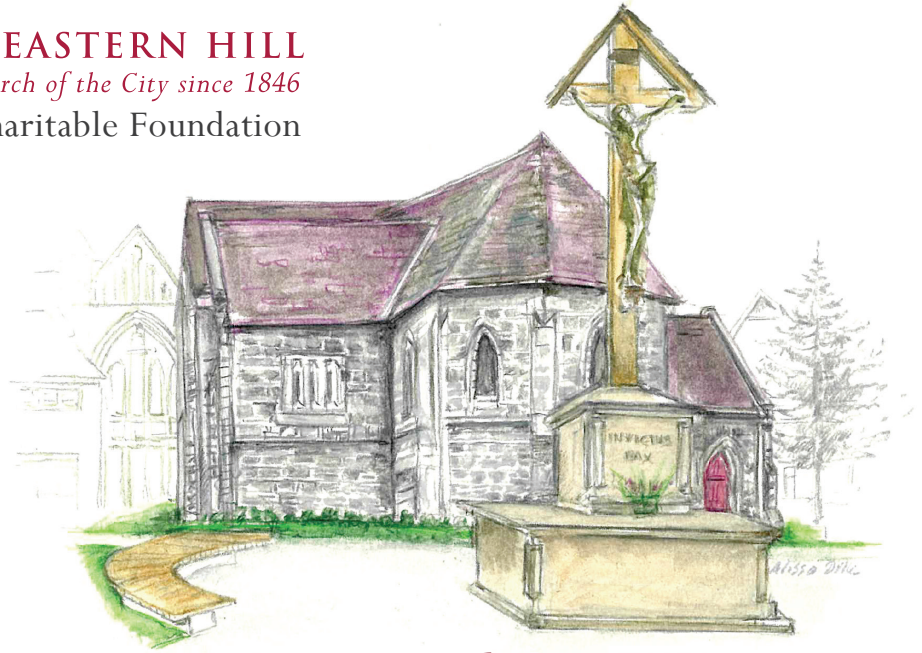

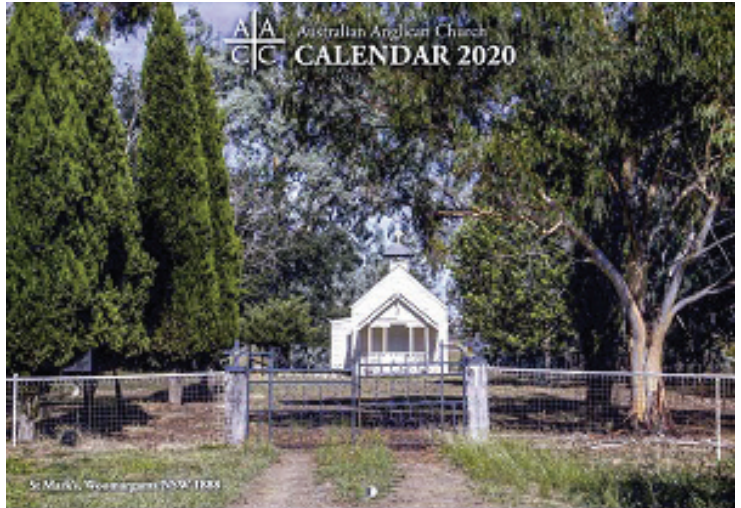
