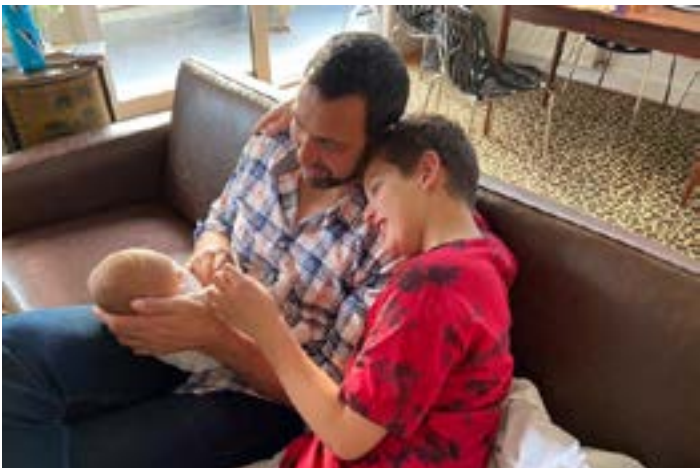

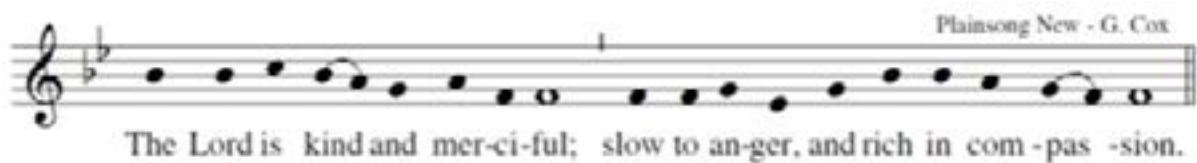


# SUNDAY MASS READINGS

## First Reading: Sirach 27.30 - 28.7

Anger and wrath, these are abominations, yet a sinner holds on to them. The vengeful will face the Lord's vengeance, for he keeps a strict account of their sins. Forgive your neighbour the wrong that is done, and then your sins will be pardoned when you pray. Does anyone harbour anger against an other, and expect healing from the Lord? If one has no mercy toward an other like oneself, can one then seek pardon for one's own sins? If a mere mortal harbours wrath, who will make an atoning sacrifice for that one's sins? Remember the end of your life, and set enmity aside; remember corruption and death, and be true to the commandments. Remember the commandments, and do not be angry with your neighbour; remember the covenant of the Most High, and overlook faults.

## Psalm 103.1-2, 3-4, 9-10, 11-12



Bless the Lord, O my soul,  
and all that is within me, bless his holy name.

Bless the Lord, O my soul,  
and do not forget all his benefits. R.

It is the Lord who forgives all your iniquity,

**Second Reading:** Romans 14.7-9

My brothers and sisters, we do not live to ourselves, and we do not die to ourselves. If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. For to this end Christ died and lived again, so that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living.

**Gospel:** Matthew 18.21-35

Peter came and said to Jesus, "Lord, a brother or sister sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times. For this reason the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his slaves. When he began the reckoning, one who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him; and, as he could not pay, his lord ordered him to be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, and payment to be made. So the slave fell on his knees before him, saying, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything.' The lord of that slave released him and forgave him the debt. "But that same slave, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow slaves who owed him a hundred denarii; and seizing him by the throat, he said, 'Pay what you owe.' Then his fellow slave fell down and pleaded with him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.' But he refused; then he went and threw him into prison until he would pay the debt. When his fellow slaves saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place. Then his lord summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked slave! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. Should you not have had mercy on your fellow slave, as I had mercy on you?' And in anger his lord handed him over to be tortured until he would pay his entire debt. So my heavenly Father will also do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother or sister from your heart."

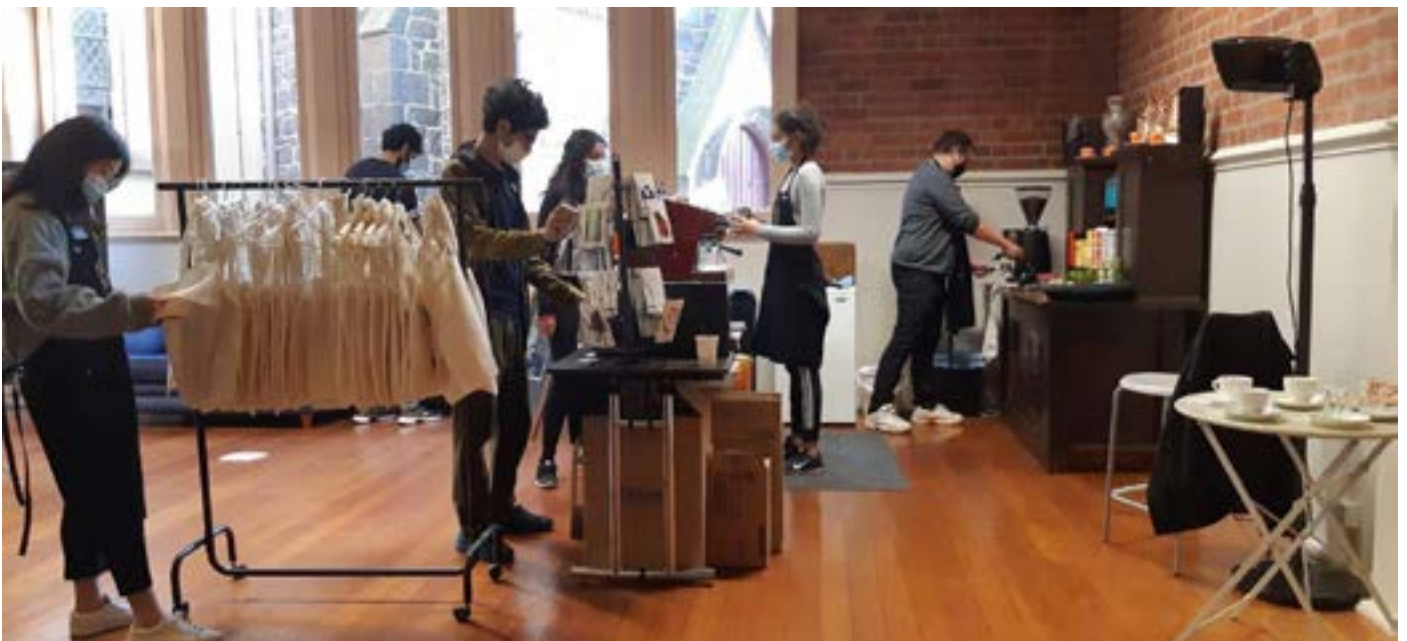

From 20 August (just before St Bartholomew's Day) to 22 November (Christ the King), I will endeavour to walk a pilgrimage from my parish of St Peter's in Box Hill to each of the five Cathedrals of the Province. Obviously while in lockdown I can't do this for real so it will be a **VIRTUAL pilgrimage**. I will walk 10 km a day around my home and will plot my progress on a map as if I were walking around the Province.

I will virtually visit each Cathedral along the way, receive a virtual welcome from the Dean and community of each Cathedral and build the relationship between Box Hill and these Cathedrals. I will blog about the pilgrimage weekly at:

- St Paul's Cathedral, Bendigo to Holy Trinity Cathedral, Wangaratta: 205 km
- Holy Trinity Cathedral, Wangaratta to St Paul's Cathedral, Sale: 272 km
- St Paul's Cathedral, Sale to St Paul's Cathedral, Melbourne: 213 km
- St Paul's Cathedral, Melbourne to St Peter's Parish, Box Hill: 14 km

### Churches offer international students bags of help and hope

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS have been among the main groups to fall through the cracks of government support offered to Australians during the COVID-19 pandemic. But churches in Melbourne's eastern suburbs have stepped up to lend a hand and provide hope to them.

St Thomas' Burwood runs an annual Food Drive to provide help to the needy "in Burwood and Beyond", but the pan-

demis put paid to that, too, this year. So the church turned its attention to those hit hardest by the impacts of the global virus and international students - often unable to return home as Australia's borders were shut, losing the jobs that helped them pay for food and rent and being denied benefits such as JobSeeker - stood out.

The Lead Minister of St Thomas', the Revd John Carrick, said the bags for this

### Leading local Anglican joins campaign to house detained refugees

A PROMINENT Melbourne Anglican is one of many Australians prepared to open their homes to refugees being kept in indefinite immigration detention.

Ms Leigh Mackay, a Canon Emerita of St Paul's Cathedral and a former Registrar of the Melbourne diocese, told TMA that the #HomeSafeWithUs campaign reflected community anxiety about asylum seekers being kept in detention in Australia.

"I think the risk of COVID infection in detention settings is an added pressure on the Government," Ms Mackay said.

"When this proposal came up for offering a place to people who would not be dependent on the Government ... I thought I would volunteer.

"I have been a supporter of the Asylum Seeker Resource Centre for a very long time and also the Brigade.

## **AN INITIATIVE OF THE PASTORAL CARE TEAM**

Our Pastoral Care Team last month launched the St Peter's Prayer Link. We are inviting parishioners and others to submit prayer requests, which will trigger focused prayer support from a small group of prayers, for one month from the date of the request being made. Further prayer requests may be made, but the prayer focus does not automatically continue beyond a month.

The St Peter's Prayer Link does not replace the weekly Prayer List that is published in the Pew Sheet, and used at Mass each day of the week. Rather, this is intended as a prayer boost, additional private prayer support for those who request it.

Prayers for the month may be requested for those who are sick, but also for particular situations or concerns that are weighing heavily on you. They say that a problem shared is a problem halved. Similarly, a prayer shared is a prayer multiplied.

Fr Roger Prowd is the St Peter's Prayer Link coordinator. The others in the Prayer Link are: Fr Hugh, Di Clark, Elizabeth Pemberton, Xeverie Swee, and Peter Yewers.

Confidentiality is of course paramount to this model of prayer support, so be assured that prayer requests will be kept strictly private amongst the Prayer Link group. Prayer requests will not be made public at Mass, nor shown in the Pew Sheet.

To ensure effective, confidential and accurate communication, all prayer requests should be made to the coordinator, Fr Roger, only. Fr Roger will then pass the request to the others in the Prayer Link. If you would like additional confidentiality for your prayer request, just mention this to Fr Roger, and your petition will be circulated to the Prayer Link group anonymously.
