We will also be giving thanks for the commencement this month of our social enterprise coffee caravan “Heaven at The Hill” and ongoing plans for development of the Lazarus Centre homeless breakfast program, with our project partners Anglicare Victoria.

MASS READINGS

First Reading: Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

As I watched, thrones were set in place, and an Ancient One took his throne; his clothing was white as snow, and the hair of his head like pure wool; his throne was fiery flames, and its wheels were burning fire. A stream of fire issued and flowed out from his presence. A thousand thousand served him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood attending him. The court sat in judgement, and the books were opened. As I watched in the night visions, I saw one like a human being coming with the clouds of heaven. And he came to the Ancient One and was presented before him. To him was given dominion and glory and kingship, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not pass away, and his kingship is one that shall never be destroyed.

The great dragon was thrown down, that ancient serpent, who is called the Devil and Satan, the deceiver of the whole world—he was thrown down to the earth, and his angels were thrown down with him.

Then I heard a loud voice in heaven, proclaiming, ‘Now have come the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God and the authority of his Messiah, for the accuser of our comrades has been thrown down, who accuses them day and night before our God. But they have conquered him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, for they did not cling to life even in the face of death.

Rejoice then, you heavens and those who dwell in them! But woe to the earth and the sea, for the devil has come down to you with great wrath, because he knows that his time is short!’

GETTING THERE:

- By train: there is a direct train departing from Melbourne Southern Cross Station and arriving at Camperdown. Services depart four times a day, and operate every day. The journey takes approximately 2h 40m and costs around \$25. Let us know if you are coming by train and someone will pick you up from Camperdown Station.
- By car: retreatants may prefer to drive to Camperdown. If you are taking your car, and are happy to car-pool, please let us know.

OTHER PRACTICALITIES:

- BYO linen: to keep the cost of the retreat down, we ask you to please bring your own sheets and pillowslips.
- Shared meals: likewise, to reduce costs, and in the Benedictine spirit of “prayer and work,” we are inviting participants to share in the cooking and catering. Once you have signed up, we will allot one meal (a lunch or dinner) to each pair of participants. The Abbey is close to the Camperdown shops if you need to pick up provisions for your meal.

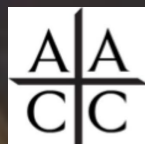

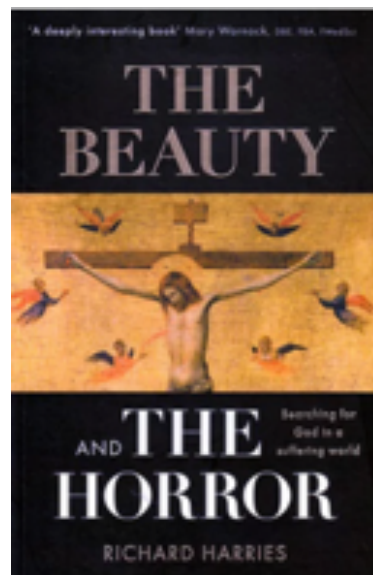

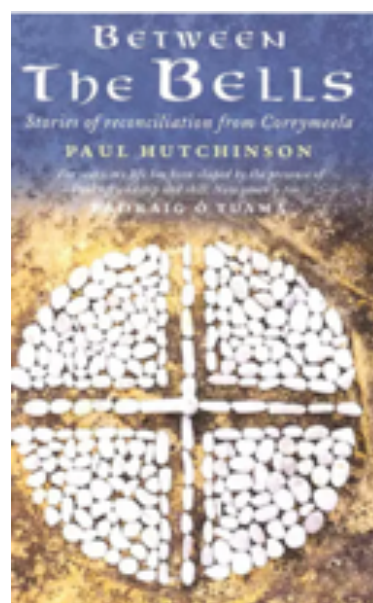
