VICAR'S MUSINGS

Welcome, on this day of St Peter's Patronal Festival. Our guest preacher today is the Venerable Rob Sutherland csc, who is currently the Anglican Principal Chaplain, Honorary Brigadier, and Archdeacon to the Australian Army. Rob joined the Army at seventeen and served as an Infantry Officer for twenty years. Since ordination, he has been a prison chaplain, parish priest, Rector of St John's Gordon in Sydney, and for the past 20 years, either part-time or full-time, an Army Chaplain. He has deployed overseas on operations seven times as a chaplain, mainly with Australian Special Forces. Rob is passionate about the Gospel and the Body of Christ and helping Veterans and others dealing with moral injury or spiritual wounds; he is a Churchill Fellow and completed a Masters in this area. He is also a proud son of St Peter's parishioners Geoff and Margaret! A very warm welcome to you Fr Rob and your family.

THE SHRINE OF OUR LADY OF WALSINGHAM

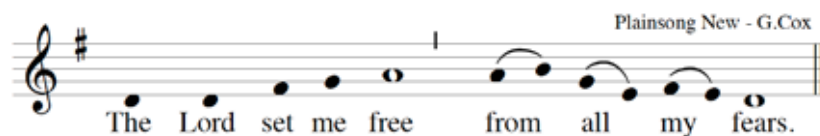
The Shrine Church in Walsingham contains a replica of the Holy House of Nazareth where our Lord spent his early years on earth. The church is adorned richly but the Holy House witnesses to the simplicity of the life of Jesus. The stature of Our Lady is in the House where candles are perpetually burning for our prayers. The Shrine is known as England's Nazareth & only Canterbury is a more popular place of pilgrimage in the Anglican Communion. Prayers for the conversion of the nations, for the reunion of Christendom & for the needy are continuously offered. Our prayers, left before the Shrine in The Chapel of Our Lady, are one with the prayers of Walsingham.

MASS READINGS

First Reading: Acts 12.1-11

In those days, King Herod laid violent hands upon some who belonged to the church. He had James, the brother of John, killed with the sword. After he saw that it pleased some of the people, he proceeded to arrest Peter also. This was during the festival of Unleavened Bread. When he had seized him, he put him in prison and handed him over to four squads of soldiers to guard him, intending to bring him out to the people after the Passover. While Peter was kept in prison, the church prayed fervently to God for him. The very night before Herod was going to bring him out, Peter, bound with two chains, was sleeping between two soldiers, while guards in front of the door were keeping watch over the prison. Suddenly an angel of the Lord appeared and a light shone in the cell. He tapped Peter on the side and woke him, saying, "Get up quickly." And the chains fell off his wrists. The angel said to him, "Fasten your belt and put on your sandals." He did so. Then he said to him, "Wrap your cloak around you and follow me." Peter went out and followed him; he did not realize that what was happening with the angel's help was real; he thought he was seeing a vision. After they had passed the first and the second guard, they came before the iron gate leading into the city. It opened for them of its own accord, and they went outside and walked along a lane, when suddenly the angel left him. Then Peter came to himself and said, "Now I am sure that the Lord has sent his angel and rescued me from the hands of Herod and from all that the people were expecting."

From now on there is reserved for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have longed for his appearing. The Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. So I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and save me for his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory forever and ever. Amen.

Gospel: Matthew 16.13-19

When Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" And they said, "Some say John the Baptist, but others Elijah, and still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." And Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

COFFEE CARAVAN UPDATE AND TASTING TODAY

The St Peter's Social Enterprise Management Committee is working hard towards the imminent launch of the Coffee Caravan. We now have an electric jockey wheel to move the caravan out onto the street frontage each day. This past week Genovese Coffee agreed to provide, free of charge, coffee, umbrellas, and professional advice ahead of the launch. On Wednesday Melbourne City Council granted compliance so we can now legally serve coffee and food to passers-by from the Corner Plaza, Monday to Friday each week. The last steps now include finalising the design and purchase of uniforms, sign writing, setting up umbrellas, purchasing an EFTPOS machine etc. Parishioners are warmly invited to a tasting today after High Mass. The coffee will be free, and your feedback and encouragement will be much appreciated. For today only, the Coffee Caravan will be situated in the Parish Hall courtyard.

PARISH SUPPORT TEAM PROCESS UPDATE

Last month the Parish Council unanimously voted in support of Bp Genieve's recommended 'Support Teams Process for Parishes Experiencing Conflict'. The role of this team is to assist and support the leadership of the parish to deal well with conflict and to discern how to move forward constructively. While the team needs to understand the background, they do not take sides in a disagreement, make any decisions for the parish or arbitrate on a dispute. A flyer outlining more detail on this Diocesan process and role is available at the back of Church, and on Sundays at the Welcome Table in the Parish Hall. The Bishop's delegates supporting the process are: the Rev'd Wendy Wade and Dr Alan Grant. Over the past 4 weeks Wendy and Alan have held initial meetings with the Vicar, Wardens, Parish Council and some staff members. The Rev'd Mark McDonald has now been appointed to strengthen the team and enable work to continue during Alan's planned absence for the next month or so. Follow up meetings will be arranged with the parish leadership and the support team is also considering the timing of additional meetings with small groups of interested parishioners over the next several weeks. 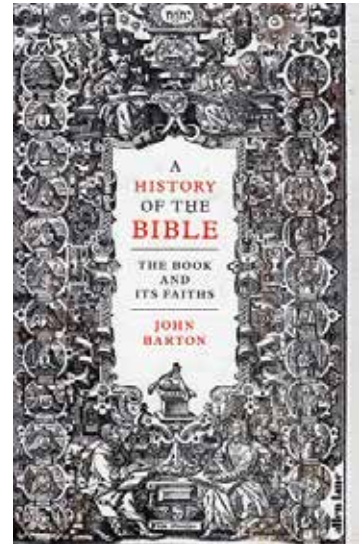

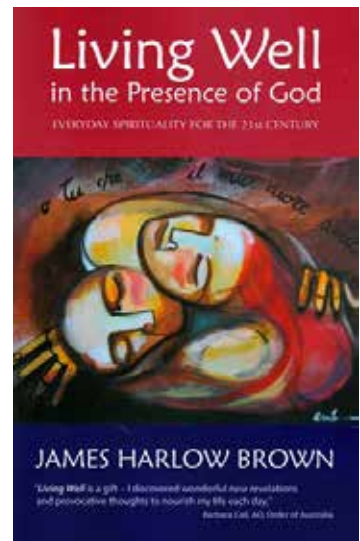


A History of the Bible
